

Incredibly Cool Coaches Information 2025 - 2026 Season

<u>Intro</u>

Thank you Thank You from the bottom of our hearts for an absolutely incredible 2024-2025 season! We watched over 3000 routines, across 14 events in all 4 corners of the UK and NI!

We celebrated our 10th year anniversary with a record number of Bid Winners and Grand Champions, and saw the introduction of the new Standout Awards at each event.

We are thrilled to welcome you to our events in the upcoming season!

2025-2026 Season

We've been busy behind the scenes, planning for 2025-2026 and are excited to bring you all the information you need to know!

• Terms and Conditions

We kindly ask if you aren't already, that you familiarise yourself with these for entering ICE competitions. These are the terms and conditions you as the programme owner/coach agree to every time you register for a competition (whether payment has been made or not). You can click a link to these on the pop up you receive when you register for an event on Regchamp. A copy is also available at the bottom of the ICE website.

Entering / Administration for competitions

To secure your place in an event, we will require a small deposit of £200 which is payable at the time of registration.

You will need to register each routine you plan to bring to that event. We appreciate that athletes / divisions may not yet be confirmed, so you will need to select a "holding division" for every routine you wish to enter. Athletes and Team names can be added at a later stage, but it is imperative that a division is applied for each routine.

Last season, many of our events sold out within the first 4 weeks of registration opening, therefore it's really important that you ensure the number of routines entered is correct. Should we need to close a competition early, we can only include those routines that are assigned. Please check with us if you have any queries at the time of registration. Where there is space available, routines can be added later on

We will close entries to a competition once the maximum number of routines has been reached (and this may be earlier than the early bird registration date).

Once registration closes 4 weeks before an event, we spend that time planning and organising the finer details – ordering trophies, arranging wristband packs, planning first aid cover - just to mention some examples. We therefore ask that you ensure that your registration = team rosters, routine divisions, coaches attending and spectator tickets are all included and correct, and that final balances

have been paid by this time. A £25 per routine late change fee will be applied where division changes are requested after this date. The fee will also be applied to athlete roster changes (excluding for injury reasons).

Wristband orders will close 2 weeks before the event. Tickets will be sold on the door for sessions – only where available.

We only sell tickets directly to the club/programme. We kindly ask that programme spectators do not contact us directly asking for tickets.

Running Orders will be released shortly after registration closes. You will be given 2 weeks to submit any running order change requests. We will then action those requests where possible and release a final version of the running order by the weekend before the event. We do not release running orders to the general public and will direct any requests from parents to the head coach.

We will communicate a coaches information email for each event approximately 1 week before the competition. This will include specific details for that venue and event – while much of the information will be similar for events, please check for any new information and anything that needs to be communicated to your athletes and supporters.

• Competition Day!

We can't stress enough that the doors opening times are the earliest opportunity that your programme can enter a venue. We are bound by contracts with our venues in regard to times that we can open the doors and allow everyone in.

This also applies to spectators arriving for later sessions. We are unable to allow spectators in to an earlier session, therefore we recommend they don't arrive earlier than the doors opening times for that session.

Allocated Seating

Due to the nature of our events, we <u>may</u> allocate seats for each team's spectators. ICE Staff will advise if this is applicable when you arrive for your event / session.

<u>Seats are for spectators only.</u> We kindly ask that bags are kept stored on the floor (not on a seat) and that athletes use the space around the competition floor for their seating. Here, they are able to watch the competition and cheer on their peers.

We would really appreciate you communicating this information to your athletes and spectators so they know what to expect.

• Scoring / Queries

Score sheets are sent automatically via Regchamp once the judges have completed their sections. Remember, these are sent electronically, so will depend on internet connections at the time.

A Score query form will be available for you to fill in on Regchamp – the head judge will review your query, action and add notes, before setting it to reviewed – prior to the awards ceremony taking place.

<u>Etiquette</u>

We appreciate that events can be a stressful time, and we understand the importance for you and your athletes to do well at a competition. Unfortunately, last season we saw some really bad examples

of conduct and lack of sportsmanship from programmes and their supporters. Should we deem it necessary, we will be issuing deductions to programmes if we feel that their conduct and / or sportsmanship is unacceptable.

ICE do not tolerate any verbal or physical abuse towards staff. All athletes and spectators remain the responsibility of the programme coach / owner. Where behaviour towards staff and each other is deemed unacceptable, we will ask persons involved (and potentially the rest of the programme) to leave the venue.

Our aim is to provide a competitive, but fun, enjoyable experience for all, and we will continue to issue our Spirit Awards at each competition. We have of course seen some fantastic team spirit across programmes which by far outweighs the bad, and hope that this is continued going forward.

ASW Bids

Where stated, we will continue to award bids for ASW. These will be awarded in the latest session taking place across Tiny/Mini/ Youth, then Junior/Senior/Open.

• What happens next?

Regchamp will be open from Monday 18th August 2025 for registrations to the confirmed events.

We are in the process of updating the website with all of the event details as well as the scoring information for the season.

Attached below are pricing details for each event, payment deadline dates plus which events are bid and sprung floor events, and the planned session structure.
